What is Guardian Scholars?

Golden West College's Guardian Scholars Program was established to support current and former foster youth achieve their educational goals. Guardian Scholars have the opportunity to transform their lives by attaining an associate's degree, transfer to a four-year university, and/or certificate in a Career and Technical Education Program. The combination of support services and dedicated staff contribute to our Guardian Scholars' retention and achievement of their educational and personal goals.



Requirements

- Current/former foster youth
- Provide proof of Ward of the Court/Dependency Verification
- Apply to EOPS Program, financial aid (FAFSA) & Chafee Grant
- Must apply to Guardian Scholars Program before 35th birthday
- Must enroll 9 units minimum
- Must be California Resident

Guardian Scholars Services

- Material, health & Associated Student Body fees paid
- Personal, academic & career counseling
- Textbook services
- Food/hygiene pantry
- Specific Career & Technical Education Program costs paid
- Graduation scholarship
- Referrals for housing, transportation & clothing



What is CAFYES?

The Cooperating Agencies Foster Youth Education Support (CAFYES) Program is designed to assist current or former foster youth whose dependency was established or continued by the court on or after a student's 16th birthday. The CAFYES Program assists qualified students to balance their needs with financial assistance and additional support services.



Requirements

- Participate in EOPS Program
- Must enroll 9 units minimum
- Have dependency established or continued by the Court on or after student's 16th birthday
- Be under 26 years of age prior to beginning of the academic year

Financial Aid Assistance

- FAFSA application
- Chafee Grants (for eligible foster youth)
- Board of Governor's Fee Waiver
- Federal Work-Study (available work opportunities on campus)
- Scholarships



EOPS Program

EOPS stands for "Extended Opportunity Programs and Services." EOPS is a state funded program that goes above and beyond to serve students who have the potential to succeed in college. This program assists students to complete a certificate, an Associate Degree and/or transfer to a four-year university. Students may qualify for the Guardian Scholars Program and/or CAFYES in addition to the EOPS Program.
